Dear BCPS Families,

In this time of COVID-19, nearly every student and educator in the nation is being faced with unforeseen challenges. But at BCPS, this time of uncertainty has let our true colors show. **Our students are strong and resilient, our educators are some of the best in the nation, and our community has rallied around us. We know we will get through this together.**

This week marks the official launch of the Battle Creek Public Schools At-Home Learning Plan to help students continue to learn and stay connected during school closure. I know many of you have questions about what the rest of the school year will look like for your student. We hear you, and we are here to support you.

Here's what to expect for your student:

AT-HOME LEARNING

Our plan is designed to make sure that students have assignments to work on and learn from and that the relationships between students and their teachers and other staff mentors stay strong. You should receive a call from your child's teacher or another staff member one to two times per week to assign work, review progress, hear how things are going and check in on their wellbeing.

Work for grades 6–8 will center on paper packets, which you should receive in the mail. You should have received the first packet at home during the week of April 13, and should receive the second packet early in the week of April 27. If you did not receive the first packet or have not yet heard from your child's teacher, please take a moment to update your family's address or phone number at battlecreekpublicschools.org/learningathome. If you have not received a phone call by April 24, please contact your school principal.

Teachers will be assigning at least one assignment in math and English language arts from the packet each week, but families should feel free to do more when they can. Middle school teachers may provide additional online activities to supplement packet work, using Google Classroom or Clever. Instructions for accessing these platforms can be found on battlecreekpublicschools.org/learningathome. If you have trouble logging on to any of the online resources your teacher has asked you to use, please contact helpdesk@battle-creek.k12.mi.us.

To assist with online work, we distributed Chromebook laptops to families who do not have a computer at home. If you do not have a computer and were unable to pick up a device during scheduled pickup times, please contact us at (269) 245-6129. If you do not have Wi-Fi at home, you may be able to receive it for free from Comcast or AT&T. If internet connection is not available in your area, please let us know and we may be able to provide assistance.

MEASURING PROGRESS

Above all, we want to create space for the many needs and stressors that students and families are experiencing during this time. We recognize that during a global pandemic, grades and academics cannot be a priority for every student.

All students will continue receiving assignments and receiving feedback on their work and progress, but students will not receive letter grades for work assigned during school closure. Recognizing that not all students have what they need to succeed in distance learning (like reliable internet, a place to work, or family members who are home and able to help out), no student's grades will be penalized for an inability to complete distance learning assignments. End of year report card grades will reflect grades according to where they stood on March 11, or an improved grade. Students who wish to improve their grades on work completed before closure can work with their teachers to do so.

Teachers will reach out to students and families to discuss students' levels of achievement as of the school closure (March 11) and talk about how they can improve on their letter grades if they so choose. Through personal communication with each family, it is our intent to make sure that students have every opportunity to succeed.
